



A communication inclusive venue for in person events -

- ☐ is easy to get to and find by car and public transport
- ☐ has disabled parking
- ☐ is physically accessible throughout
- ☐ has accessible toilets, preferably “Changing Places”
- ☐ has clear signs outside so people can find the building. Clear signs include understandable symbols, large print, no abbreviations, good text / background contrast. They are at low or eye level and easy to read from far away.
- ☐ is clearly signed inside so people can find their way to all the spaces they will use.
- ☐ has quiet spaces so people can hear and concentrate
- ☐ is well-lit throughout
- ☐ is set up so people can see others
- ☐ is warm and comfortable

- ☐ has tables to sit and at
- ☐ has a working hearing loop
- ☐ has a quiet separate space to relax
